Marufah was the winner in the category at the Asean Skills Competition 2016 held in Serdang, Selangor, which qualified her to compete in WorldSkills Abu

To clinch the top spot, she will be competing against nine participants from the United Arab Emirates, Macau, Japan, Belgium, Barbados, China, France, Zambia and Norway.

"I am happy but nervous to represent the country at an international event. The previous competition (Asean Skills) was held in Malaysia, but this time around, I will have to be among the international participants in a foreign country. "For that, I have to prepare myself mentally and physically and boost my level of confidence to converse in English so that I can communicate with other participants," she said.
